HB 76 / SB 396 - Public Safety Officer - Performance of Duties - Death Benefits

Sponsor:

House: Lehman et al Senate: McKay, Benson, & M. Jackson

Status:

House: Passed House
 Senate: Passed Senate

Summary:

- Adds 9-1-1 Specialist to the definition of public safety officer
- Adds a presumption of death benefits if a public safety officer has died by suicide and the individual had been diagnosed by a mental health professional with PTSD or related stress/trauma disorders as a result of the nature and performance of the individual's duties
- Original bill included disability benefits for PTSD or related acute stress disorders, which was removed in both House & Senate Committees



HB 694 - Public Schools - Individuals with Disabilities - Main Entrance Accessibility and Emergency Planning

- Sponsor: Kaufman et al
- Status: Passed House; assigned to EEE
- Summary:
 - Specifies that school safety evaluations and solutions identified for safety concerns must include consideration of individuals with disabilities
 - Requires counties to report instances where a public school facilities became inaccessible for a student with a disability in a manner that could impede evacuation or an emergency response



HB 782 - Study on Detecting Deadly Weapons in Public Middle & High Schools

- Sponsor: Atterbeary et al
- Status: Passed House; assigned to EEE
- Summary:
 - Requires Maryland Center for School Safety to study how best to detect deadly weapons in public middle and high schools and how best to rapidly report the detection of weapons to a law enforcement agency
 - Study requires evaluation of "widely accepted" methods and feasibility of using those methods to fill gaps in school safety
 - Software used for school safety and how it can best be integrated effectively
 - o Interim report due Dec 1, 2025; final due Dec 1, 2026



HB 1083 - Plan to Implement Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment Requirements

Summary

 Requires the Behavioral Health Advisory Council and Commission on Behavioral Health Care Treatment to provide recommendations to implement recommendations from a CMMS letter related to early and periodic screening, diagnostic, and treatment requirements for children



HB 1146 / SB 900 - Integration of 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline Network and Outcome Evaluations

Summary

- Updates current 988 statute to require an evaluation of outcomes of services in each jurisdiction or region
- Includes call volume, answer rate, resolution data (including whether mobile crisis was dispatched and related response data), involvement of law enforcement, and hospital diversion



SB 81/HB445 - Criminal Law - Interference with a Public Safety Answering Point - Penalties

Summary

Makes intent to disrupt a PSAP a felony punishable by \$25,000 fine, 5
years in jail, or both
