Where did this start?

- Governor's Office of Homeland Security review of the Naval Yard Shooting in September 2013
- Questions were posed on delayed EMS response to victims
- MSP / MIEMSS were tasked to convene an interdisciplinary workgroup
 - Investigated current literature on similar incidents
 - Suggested general guidelines for response
 - Developed and identified training
 - Identified gaps



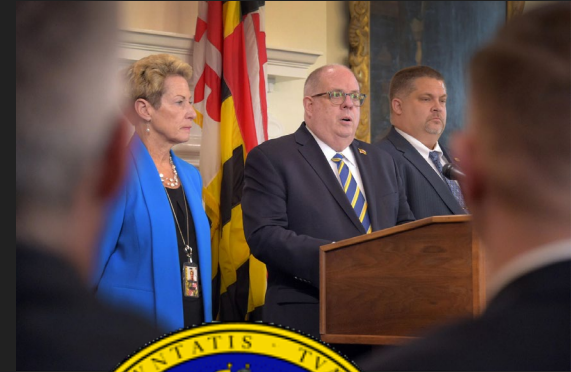


2014 Guideline

- Guidance Document Published in October 2014
 - EMS Protocol Update
 - Equipment recommendations
 - Planning template for other agencies and companies
 - Used as a template across the US

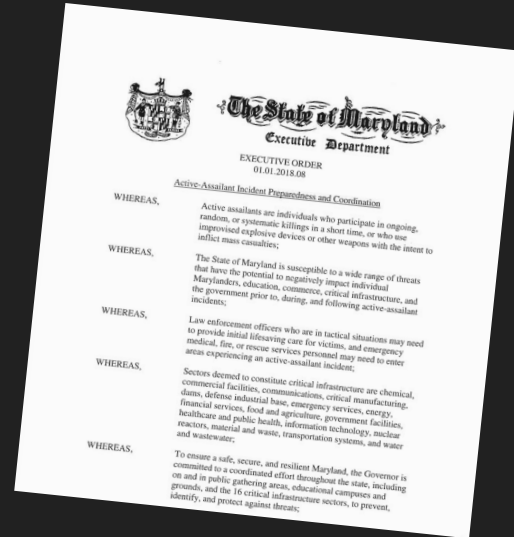
Executive Order

- Governor Hogan Signed and Announced February 28, 2018
 - Active Assailant incident Preparedness and Coordination
- Key Points
 - Each state agency shall participate in coordinated active assailant planning
 - Each state agency and those under that agency, shall develop, plan, and collaborate for active assailant training relevant to their responsibility and include govt / non-govt participants
 - Using “whole community” approach, executive-agency public safety officials shall conduct annual assessments to determine need for mitigation, planning and training appropriate for their jurisdiction



Executive Order (cont.)

- School Relevant Points
 - Maryland's public educational institutions, private and nonpublic educational institutions SHALL be encouraged to share and coordinate their emergency plans with law enforcement, emergency management and emergency responders
- Maryland Active Assailant Interdisciplinary Work Group will add representatives from
 - Maryland Department of Health
 - Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention
 - Maryland State Department of Education
 - Maryland Higher Education Commission



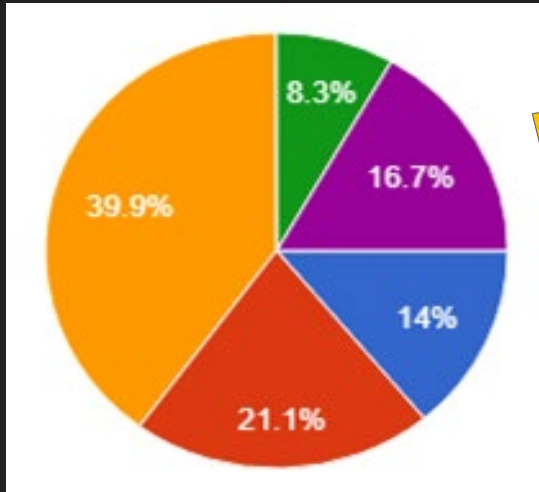
• Survey Says...

- Fire/EMS- 23 Responses
- Law Enforcement- 36 Responses
- Emergency Management- 4 Responses
- School System- 28 Responses
- Private Sector/ MD Citizen- 62 Responses



Survey Says....

- 96.7% Responses from Public Schools
- 60% Elementary / 17% Middle / 19% High

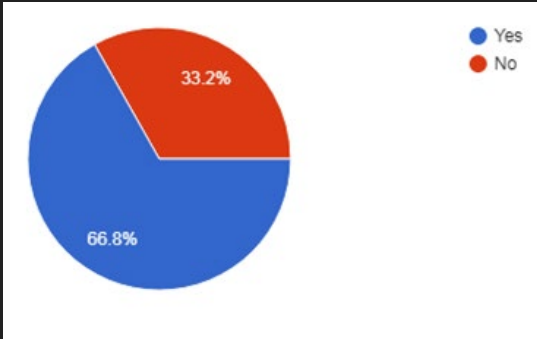


- Western (Garrett, Allegany, Washington, Frederick)

Survey Says...

- **Emergency Planning**

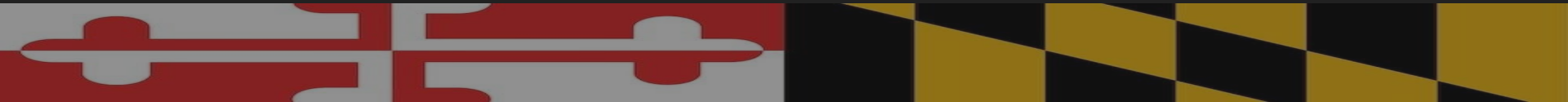
- 97% of emergency plans are updated within the last year
- 67% received input from local emergency management / first responders
- 88% of the emergency plans are internal only
 - 48% are shared with law enforcement
 - 30% are shared with fire / EMS
 - 22% are shared with emergency management





Work Group Charter

- The work group will develop a charter to provide preliminary delineation of roles and responsibilities, identify stakeholders and define authority of work group management
